Top Tips for supporting your child with their mathematical development...

- 1. Sing and act our number rhymes. This will help them recite numbers in order and give you opportunities to develop their mathematical understanding of number and calculations.
- 2. When sharing a book look for counting opportunities and reinforce the use of positional vocabulary when talking about the illustrations.
- 3. Encourage your child to tidy away. This is a great way to reinforce positional vocabulary and matching shapes. They can sort toys into colours and shapes.
- 4. Get your child to help set the table, put the shopping away, sort out the washing. Again this helps with matching shapes and positional vocabulary as well as counting.
- 5. Cook/bake with your children. This introduces them to the concept of measuring. Use cups instead of grams.
- 6. Play with play dough. It's a great way to talk about length and size as well as shape.
- 7. Talk about daily routines. This introduces your child to the concept and vocabulary of time.
- 8. When playing with cars and trains reinforce sequencing and ordering skills and vocabulary as well as counting.
- 9. Give your child opportunities to develop the spatial awareness skills (as well as their motor skills) by playing outside in larger spaces.
- 10. Involve your child in growing plants. Through this there are opportunities to estimate, measure, talk about the passing of time such as seasons, months and days.
